Sebring International Raceway is America's oldest permanent road racing facility. The 57th running of the Mobil 1 Twelve Hours of Sebring presented by Fresh from Florida takes place on Saturday, March 21st.

Since the first running of Sebring's 12-hour sports car classic in 1952 over 3,000 drivers have raced 2.3 million miles during 672 hours of racing. Every race offers epic achievements and dramatic finishes on the legendary 3.7-mile circuit. However, only 105 drivers have managed to win the world's toughest endurance race.

A list of former Sebring winners is like a Who's Who of racing: Phil Hill, Stirling Moss, Juan Manuel Fangio, Dan Gurney, Mario Andretti, Jim Hall, Jacky Ickx, Al Holbert, Bobby Rahal, Brian Redman and A.J. Foyt ... just to name a few.

Sebring has become the ultimate proving ground for automotive manufacturers. Over 130 different marques have raced at Sebring, with drivers and teams from 43 different countries entering the event over six decades. However, only seven manufacturers have managed to win the famous once-around-the-clock classic more than once. Porsche leads with 18 victories, followed by Ferrari with 12 and Audi with eight.

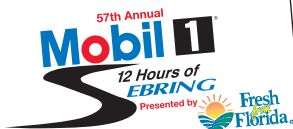

FREE ON-SITE PARKING & CAMPING

Sebring International Raceway offers free on-site parking and camping. A large area adjacent to the front gate has been designated as free parking and camping for race fans attending the 57th Annual Mobil 1 Twelve Hours of Sebring Presented by Fresh from Florida. Within a short walk of all the action (tram service will be offered Friday and Saturday), this will allow spectators to camp near the track and avoid parking fees.

NOTE: Early arrival camping outside the track will not be allowed until March 1, 2009.

Raceway Facilities & Services

THE FRONT GATE IS OPEN 24 HOURS A DAY BEGINNING WEDNESDAY, MARCH 18 at 6 am. Spectators leaving the track who wish to return must obtain a Pass Out.

For participants, media and special guests, the **SIR Registration Office** will be open daily from 7 am to 6 pm and closed early on Saturday. It is located in the raceway administration building near the front entrance of the raceway (use Gate 2).

WILL CALL: Located in the administration building. Tickets are held under the name on the order form and cannot be released to a party other than that name (photo I.D. required). There are no cancellations on pre-purchased tickets and no refunds of unclaimed Will Call tickets.

CREDIT CARD SALES: MasterCard, Visa, American Express and Discover are accepted.

FIRST AID: Highlands Regional Medical Center first aid stations are located on the Midway and at the Paddock Medical Center.

RESTROOMS: Located throughout the facility, including the Paddock, pit tower, Midway and Green Park. *See Map.*

SHOWERS: Located behind the Midway restrooms.

PHONES: Pay phones are located throughout the facility.

SCANNER RENTALS: Available from speed.com communications in the Paddock (east of the tower in the pit structure adjacent to official souvenirs).

ATM: Located at the front entrance and in the Paddock vendor area. *See Map.*

LOST & FOUND: Located in the raceway administration building.

Please bring this Guest Guide with you to the race for your reference.

Sebring International Raceway Policies

- Race runs rain or shine. **No ticket refunds.**
- **No off-road vehicles** (including ATVs, ATCs, dune buggies and bicycles) will be permitted.
- Raceway closes promptly at noon, Sunday, March 22.
- **No spectator golf carts allowed.**
- Children 12 and under free with paying adult.
- Remember to bring your ticket. Sebring Raceway does NOT replace lost, stolen or “forgotten” tickets.
- Handicapped viewing and parking areas available.
- Motorcycles allowed only in designated areas.
- **No pets.**
- **No scaffolding** over 6 feet.
- **Charcoal fires only** will be permitted.
- Medical facilities on premise.
- **No smoking** allowed in pit box area.
- Before leaving the track, everyone must receive a Pass-Out at the Main Gate. Upon re-entry, you must then show your ticket and surrender your Pass-Out.
- Individual camping areas must not be roped.
- All illegally parked vehicles will be towed and impounded at owner’s expense.
- No furniture may be left on raceway property. All campsites must be cleaned before departure.
- All occupants in moving vehicles must be seated.
- No firearms, fireworks or explosive devices.
- No cruising allowed in the Competitor Paddock.
- Spectators must carry their ticket with them at all times.

Frequently Asked Questions

Where is Sebring International Raceway? Sebring is located in Highlands County about 90 miles from Tampa, Orlando and the Palm Beaches. The track is adjacent to Sebring Regional Airport, just off Highway 98, three miles east of US 27.

When is the 2009 12 Hour Race? March 18-21. The Mobil 1 Twelve Hours of Sebring presented by Fresh from Florida starts at 10 am on Saturday, March 21st. There is no racing activity on Sunday.

What cars run in the Mobil 1 Twelve Hours of Sebring? The American Le Mans Series, featuring the same cars and drivers that compete in the famous 24 Hours of Le Mans in France.

What other racing events take place? Six different supporting series will race at Sebring prior to the 12 hour race.

What type of tickets should I purchase? The "Superticket" is the most popular ticket at Sebring. It is offered as a four-day or Saturday-only ticket. Supertickets include access to the paddock, where the race teams are located. Supertickets purchased by February 13th are \$10 less than tickets purchased at the gate. Other types of tickets include Pit Box seats in the open-air viewing area of the pit structure, overlooking the front straight. Club Sebring is the most exclusive ticket at Sebring, and includes access to the Club Sebring suite overlooking the pits, complimentary beverages all four days and catered meals on Saturday.

If I purchase a Saturday-only ticket, when can I enter the raceway? Beginning Friday at 8 pm.

How do I purchase tickets? You can order online or by calling 800-626-7223. Credit cards accepted are MasterCard, Visa, Discover and American Express.

Do kids have to purchase a ticket? No. All children 12 and under are admitted free as long as there is an adult accompanying them. The exception is Club Sebring and Pit Box access, where a child's ticket is required.

When is the Will Call window open? Tickets can be picked up at Will Call 24 hours per day. Will Call is located on the Registration side of the Sebring International Raceway office building located at the front entrance of the track (Gate 2).

If I can't attend, can I get a refund? There are absolutely no refunds under any circumstances.

What about car parking? Sebring offers both reserved trackside parking and first-come first-serve parking. All automobiles must pay a \$25 charge to enter the raceway for first-come first-serve parking in General Car Parking (If you arrive with four or more people in your automobile, that fee will be waived) and \$75 for General RV Parking or \$75 for North Paddock Car Parking and \$95 for North Paddock RV Parking. Any vehicle that is pulling another vehicle (trailer, pop-up camper, etc) will need to purchase BOTH a Car and RV parking. Reserved trackside parking for motor-

homes and cars is very limited and must be ordered in advance. Call the raceway for more details. If you are not arriving until Saturday, it is highly recommend that you park outside the track in the free parking overflow lot and take the shuttle inside.

What about camping at Sebring? Many race fans camp at the track. Reserved trackside parking spaces are located at several locations around the circuit, although they sell-out early. Non-reserved motorhome parking is also available on a first-come first-serve basis. See the ticket order form for motorhome parking fees. Tent camping is allowed at no additional charge.

Do you have hookups for motorhomes? No.

Are there showers at the raceway? Yes.

Can I bring my own food and beverages? Yes.

Can I bring a charcoal or gas grill? Yes.

Can I meet the drivers? Sebring is one of the most spectator-friendly tracks in the world. All spectators have access to the paddock, where the race teams are located. Every team is easily accessible. An autograph session open to all fans is held on Friday, in which every driver participates.

Can I walk on the track and see the starting grid before the race? Yes! Spectators may go on the track prior to the start of the race Saturday morning and see the cars and drivers up close.

Are there special places for car clubs to gather? Yes. Many marques have special car corrals. Call for more information.

What time do the gates close at night? The gates are open 24 hours a day. Spectators can arrive anytime beginning at 6 am on Wednesday of race week.

Are there grandstands at Sebring? Sebring is a traditional road racing circuit, in which spectators can walk from turn to turn and watch the action. There are elevated viewing berms at several locations. In addition, the Pit Box seats offer an elevated view of the front straight.

What else is there to do at the raceway? Vintage race car displays, the Party Zone, special "Tech Talk" and autograph sessions for fans, and many other activities take place during race week.

Can I drive a motorcycle at the race? Motorcycles are now allowed to enter the raceway and park in a designated area. They may NOT go anywhere else on the raceway property.

Can I bring a bicycle, scooter or ATV? No. Positively no vehicles of this type are allowed inside the raceway.

Can I bring a golf cart? No.

Can I bring my Dog? No. Absolutely no pets are allowed.

What is the weather like at Sebring in March? Daytime temperatures are usually in the 70s. It has rained on race day only six times in 56 years, however be prepared! It can get cool at nights as well, sometimes into the 40s.

What if it rains? The Mobil 1 Twelve Hours of Sebring presented by Fresh from Florida runs rain or shine.

Is there a gift shop at Sebring? Yes. During race week, gift shops are also located in the paddock and along the midway.

Is the race broadcast locally on radio? Yes, 730 AM WWTK.

Where can I buy the souvenir program? Programs are sold at the front entrance and at several locations throughout the facility. The Sebring souvenir program is recognized as one of the best in racing and a true collectors item. After the race, they can be purchased at the Gift Shop (supply is limited and the program often sells out).

Is there an ATM at the track? Yes.

Is there a hotel at the track? Yes, the Four Points by Sheraton Chateau Elan has 122 rooms and overlooks the famous hairpin turn. Rooms during race week are very limited. For more information call 863-655-6252. There are about 1,400 hotel rooms elsewhere in Highlands County.

What facilities do you have for handicapped guests? An elevator and handicapped accessible restrooms are located in the pit structure. Designated reserved parking for disabled guests are located along the midway and in the paddock.

How can I get from the Sebring Airport to the track? The raceway offers a shuttle service between the airport and the raceway entrance.

I have heard there is a lot of wild partying at Sebring, is that true? Be assured Sebring is a family-friendly environment, and no activity is tolerated that in any way infringes on your enjoyment of the race.

I used to go to Sebring in the 1960s and 70s. The facilities were not very good back then. Have they improved? Since 1999, new owner Dr. Don Panoz has made millions of dollars in improvements, including the new Pit structure, track hotel, restrooms, and other amenities that have made Sebring one of the finest road racing circuits in North America. If you haven't been to Sebring lately, you will be pleasantly surprised.

Are there racing schools at Sebring? The Skip Barber Racing School is located at Sebring.

How do I become a volunteer at Sebring International Raceway? The Sebring International Raceway Advisory Council (SIRAC) is the official volunteer organization. For more information call Barbara Maire at 863-655-1442 x210 or email bmaire@sebringraceway.com.

In the event of severe weather, management asks all guests to seek shelter from potentially hazardous lightning. If lightning threatens, please seek shelter in your personal vehicle.

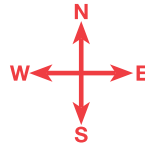

Getting Around

TRAM SERVICE: Trams run continuously from 11 am to 7 pm Friday and 7 am to 11 pm on Saturday. There is no charge for this service. *See map for tram stops.*

PADDOCK ACCESS: All Sebring tickets include access to the paddock area.

VIEWING BERMS: Several viewing berms are located adjacent to the race circuit (*see map*).

SEBRING AIRPORT/ HOTEL SHUTTLE: Shuttle service to the Airport Flight Center is available Wednesday through Saturday. The shuttle departs from the raceway administration building (registration side).

PARKING: General parking for cars is located throughout the facility (\$25.00). Free parking is located outside the track adjacent to the front entrance.

CAMPING: If you are camping, your vehicle pass must be attached to your vehicle. If you are pulling a trailer or fifth wheel, the camping pass will be attached to the unit and your tow vehicle will require a separate parking pass.

ARRIVE EARLY on Saturday. Once the raceway nears capacity, parking outside front gate will be required. Tram service will be provided.

HANDICAPPED PARKING: Designated handicapped parking spaces are located along the midway and at other locations throughout the facility (*refer to map*).

VEHICLE IMPOUND

CAR IMPOUND AREA: If your vehicle is towed you may claim it at the impound area located adjacent to security.

FRONT GATE IMPOUND: ATVs and bicycles are not allowed and will be impounded at the front gate.

Suites & Hospitality Areas

CLUB SEBRING: Second floor of the Pit structure, west of the Tower (next to the Fangio Terrace). Club Sebring parking is in the Competitor Paddock behind the Pit structure.

TURN ONE CLUB: Located at the east end of the Midway, adjacent to Turn One.

PIT BOXES: Open-air viewing area located on the second floor in the Pit structure. The Fangio Terrace is the west side of the tower, and the Gurney Terrace is the east side.

Sebring International Raceway Enhances Parking Opportunities for Club Sebring and Suite Patrons

Due to unprecedented demand for Club Sebring and Pit Suite tickets at the Mobil 1 Twelve Hours of Sebring presented by Fresh from Florida, raceway management has announced an enhanced parking and shuttle program.

Parking has always been at a premium in the Sebring paddock, and with the continued expansion of our suites, additional parking options have been created.

On Friday, March 20, and Saturday, March 21, an additional parking area for Club Sebring and Pit Suite patrons will be offered outside turn 17, adjacent to the Sebring administration building. This designated area will include a shuttle service for added convenience. The shuttle will be exclusively for Club Sebring and Pit Suite ticket holders. Please refer to the map on page 12.

Although this will increase parking opportunities, please remember that arriving early is strongly recommended, especially on Saturday.

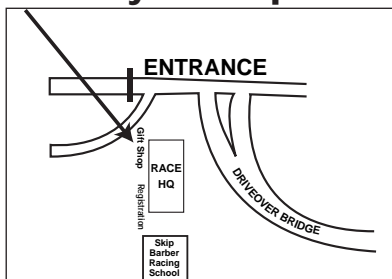

Sebring Area Info

Sebring International Raceway is the focal point of the motorsports world every March, but outside the gates of this historic race course is a diverse, fast-growing community that offers many pleasant surprises for visitors.

Sebring's central location (about 90 miles from Tampa, Orlando and West Palm Beach) has made it a home-away-from-home for many Floridians looking to escape the hustle and bustle of the coastline. Others have relocated from the north to take advantage of Sebring's great year-round climate.

Sebring and Highlands County boast a surprising lineup of recreational activities as well as shopping and dining. In addition, it is an important hub of Florida's citrus and cattle industry.

The city of Sebring has a population of about 25,000 people within its municipal limits and over 95,000 people in its trade area. During the winter season, the area's population doubles, while during race week it more than triples with over 100,000 race fans attending from all over the world.

Founded in 1912 by George E. Sebring of Ohio, the municipality was incorporated as a village in 1913 and became a city in 1923. It has been the county seat since 1921. The city has an elevation of 133 feet above sea level, with an average temperature of 73 degrees and annual rainfall of 55.23 inches. The average daytime temperature in March is 67 degrees.

The crumbling limestone of Central Florida's scenic "Ridge" has created dozens of lakes filled with clear water and lined with sandy beaches. Sebring's city limits surround Lake Jackson, a 3,000-acre natural body of water that generates much of the area's recreation. Nearby is Highlands Hammock State Park.

Sebring Regional Airport

Sebring International Raceway evolved from a World War II Army Air Base known as Hendricks Field. Sebring's aviation heritage continues today as the Sebring Regional Airport.

Sebring Regional Airport and Business Park is owned and managed by Sebring Airport Authority. The authority has over 35 years' experience in project development and property management.

If you have not seen the many new amenities, you are invited to visit Airside Center, the airport's world-class aviation terminal, completed in June of 2000. The Airside Center houses Sebring Flight Center (the airport FBO) with a Flight Planning Room with DTN weather system, Pilot's Lounge and Squadron Briefing Room with lockers and private restroom facility, including shower. Also in the Airport Center you will find a restaurant.
